Ia, Befehl. Order by SS-PZAOK 6, 21 Jan 1945, relating to movements of the 1. SS PzK with the 1. SS PzD "LSSAH" to Rotterdam and Utrecht and the 12. SS PzD "Hitlerjugend" to the Amersfoort and Zutphen areas, Netherlands, 22-23 Jan for transfer "Landmarsch" to the Kall, Euskirchen, and Liblar areas, Germany; and the II. SS PzK with the 2. SS PzD to the Pirmasens and Neunkirchen areas followed by the 9. SS PzD "Hohenstaufen" after being relieved by the 9. PzD during the night 24-25 Jan 1945, to Landau, signed by Sepp Dietrich. A telegram, dated 9 Mar 1945, from the 6. SS Panzer-Armee to SS Gruppenfuehrer Fegelein listing 2,989 personnel and materiel losses suffered during the mopping-up operations in the Gran (Esztergom) bridgehead.
