

XXX. Armeekorps (XXX Army Corps)

The XXX. Armeekorps was formed in 1939. It participated in the western campaign in 1940, was transferred to East Prussia in July 1940, and to Rumania in January 1941. The Corps fought in the Balkans in the spring of 1941 and on the eastern front from June 1941, advancing via Yampol on the Dniester River to Mariupol. It then fought in the Crimea until the transfer of the Corps to the Leningrad front in August 1942 where it took part in position defense south of Lake Ladoga. In November 1942 the Corps was transferred to the Nevel area in the central sector, and in December to the southern sector. On December 18, 1942, the Corps was designated Armee-Abteilung Fretter-Pico and on February 3, 1943, it was redesignated the XXX. Armeekorps. From December 1942 to June 1944 the Corps participated in defensive engagements as it retreated from the Don River to the Tiraspol area along the Dniester River, to Izyum and Chuguev on the Donets River, southward to Nikopol on the Dnieper River, then westward to Pervomaisk on the Bug River via Krivoi Rog.
